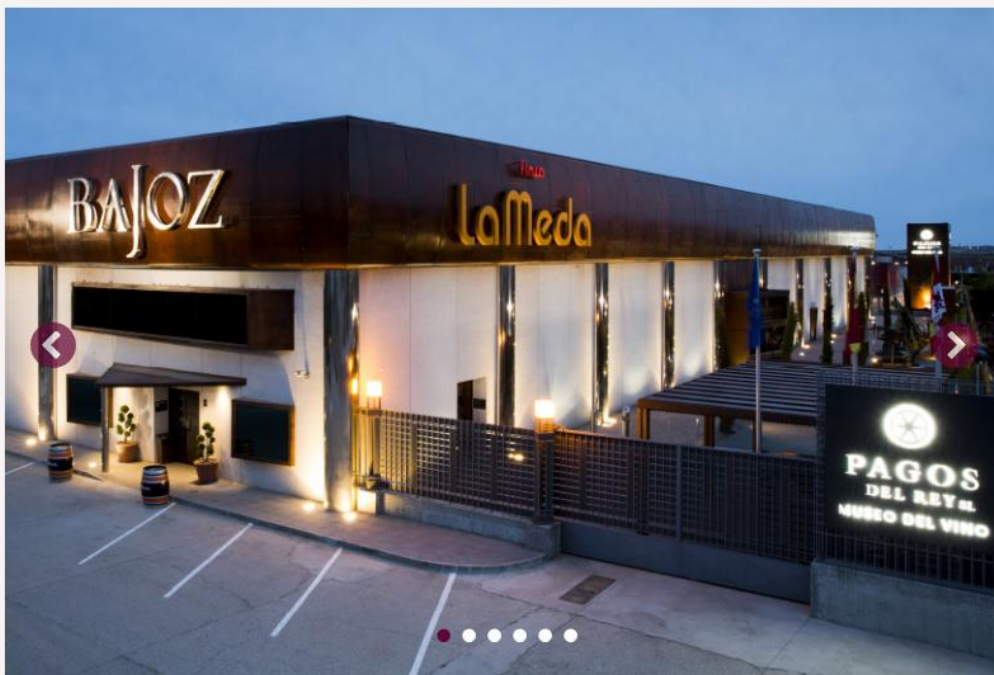


Winery in Toro

The winery



The Pagos del Rey winery – 6 km away from the **historical city of Toro** and in the province of Zamora – was established in 1952. It was originally known as *Nuestra Señora de las Viñas*, then *Vinya Bajoz* (1962) in honour of the river that runs near **Morales de Toro**. It was bought by Félix Solís Avantis in September 2008 and renamed Pagos del Rey Toro.

Today, it produces 36% of the total production of red wines from D.O. Toro.

You will see a **rock carving of a bull** at the winery. The animal is revered in Spain for providing strength and protection. It is also said to be related to the knowledge of wine. The Solís family works in partnership with family-owned vine growers covering 1,700 hectares. Traditional bush vine system of cultivation is still in use.

The Pagos del Rey Toro winery in Morales de Toro has become a **centre for wine culture and tourism**. It opened the region's first wine museum on-site in February 2014.

- 40,000 m² surface area.
- Bottling line output 4,500 bottles per hour.
- The large barrel cellar, carved out of rock 10 metres underground houses more than 4,000 American and French oak barrels.
- Total storage capacity: 18,000,000 litres.
